Video games can be a lot of fun however it can be difficult for parents to navigate the benefits and dangers of what your child might be experiencing. PEGI stands for Pan European Game Information. PEGI ratings are used to give games ages ratings.



Games considered suitable for all age ranges.



Games may contain some non-realistic violence.



Games may show more graphic and realistic-looking violence towards fantasy characters. They may also show mild sexual innuendo, sexual posturing, references to gambling and some bad language.



These games can feature death and injury to humans. Smoking, drinking alcohol, the use of illegal drugs, glamourised representation of crime and strong bad language can be shown.



These games can show 'gross' violence which may include graphic methods of death or severe injury, including torture, decapitation and dismemberment, violence against vulnerable characters (including children), sexual violence and threat.

Poly Styrene



Poly Styrene was born Marianne Joan Elliott-Said in 1957 in Bromley and was brought up in Brixton. Her mother was a Scottish-Irish legal secretary and her father was a Somalian dock worker. She was most famous for being the lead singer in the punk rock band X-Ray Spex and had a string of hits including Identity, Germ Free Adolescents and I am a Cliche.

She chose the name Poly Styrene from the Yellow Pages as she “wanted something from the time, something plastic.” She was described by Billboard as, “the archetype for the modern-day feminist punk.” She wore dental braces, sang against the objectification of women, sported a dayglo wardrobe and was of mixed-race heritage. She was described as one of the, “least conventional front persons in rock history, male or female.”




Poly released critically acclaimed solo albums after the break up of X-Ray Spex and had a daughter, Celeste, in 1981. She was a strict vegetarian and was initiated into the Hare Krishna movement in 1983. Poly was diagnosed with breast cancer in February 2011 and died in April 2011 at the age of 53.
