We will listen to a radio broadcast from Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain to create our own radio broadcast transcript. We will spend a week working as journalists for the Daily Dixon to write a news article on a Blitz bombing of London.

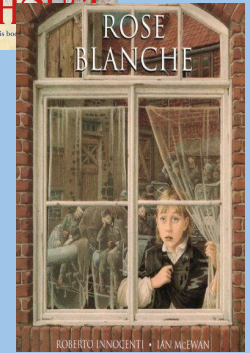
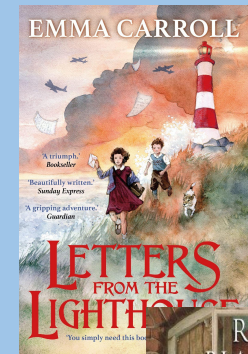
As Mathematicians, we will be learning formal methods of division and multiplication, including long multiplication and division. We will use our knowledge of fractions and ratio to calculate quantities of rationed meals.

As Historians, we will find out how and why the war started. We will look at photographs showing the devastation caused by the Blitz before examining the facts surrounding the air raids. We will explore the experiences of children who were evacuated during the war and why this was an important strategy.

As Geographers, we will identify the location of the countries that fought with both the allies and the axis powers, investigating what continents they are in and where the countries are located on a world map.
